

POST DISTRIBUTION MONITORING (PDM) REPORT

Cash Based Transfers Phase 3

May 2022



HIGHLIGHTS

The Government of Eswatini through the National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) reached **95 987** food insecure beneficiaries through the **Kirsh Foundation** supported cash based transfers.

96% of the beneficiary households reported to have cereals available within their households which were purchased through received cash aid.

Beneficiaries received aid through the Eswatini MTN's MOMO platform. **96% of the beneficiaries expressed their satisfaction in utilizing the platform for this exercise as it minimized their chances of contracting COVID-19** at cash withdrawal points.

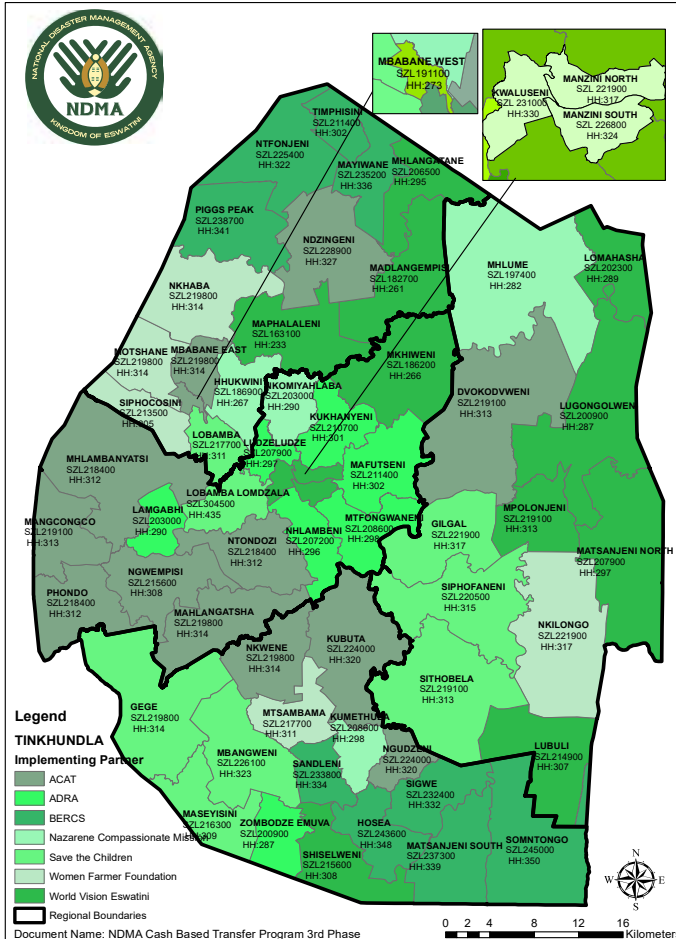
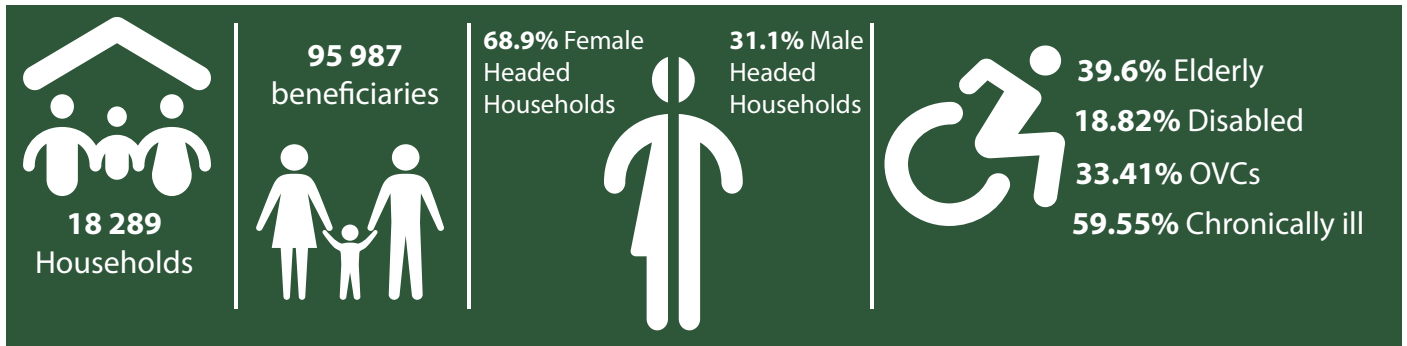


Figure 1: Locations of cash based distributions by implementing partner per region.

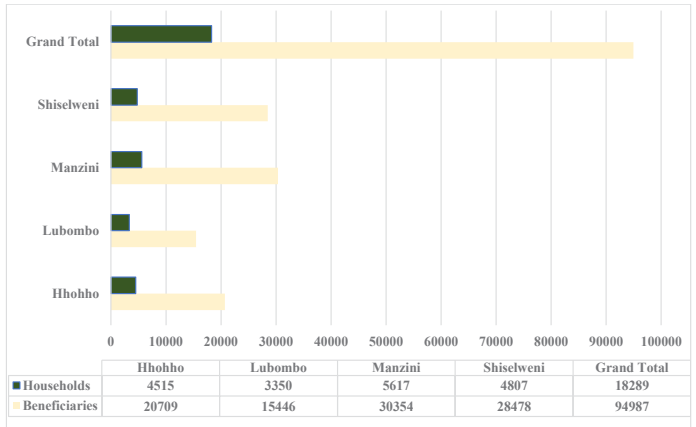


Figure 2: Phase 3 CBT Disbursement Household and Beneficiary Distribution by region.

- An average family size of six(6), was reported among households, which is higher compared to the average of five members assumed by the project
- The implementation of the project was satisfactory as **84.46% of household were satisfied** with the selection process of beneficiaries, 10.95 were neither satisfied nor dissatisfied and only 4.74% were not satisfied.
- The cash based transfers project worth E 72 million is funded by the **Kirsh Foundation**. The CBT will be distributed in six phases: approximately E12million per disbursement.
